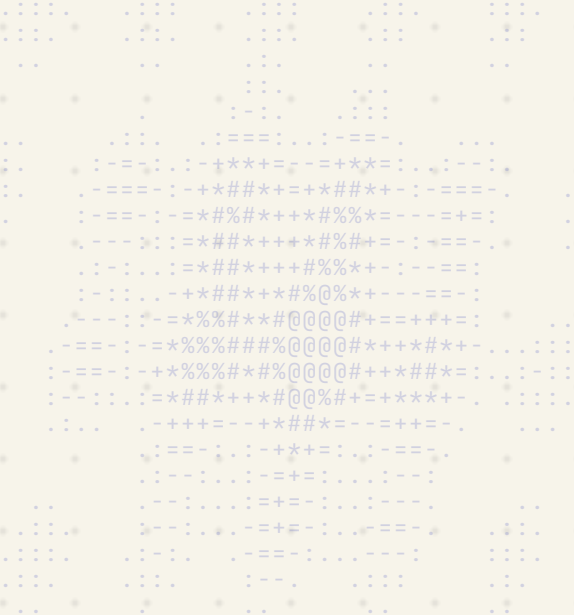

The full 10-code pack. Copy-paste power prompts that flip Claude and ChatGPT from intern mode into operator mode – the three originals plus seven new codes for compression, sparring, shipping, and compounding.

Vol. 1 gave you three codes and a promise. This is the promise kept: the full ten-code pack. Same rules as before – paste the code before your request, stack max two per conversation, re-paste if the model drifts.



THE ORIGINALS • 01-03

Quick recap from [Vol. 1](#) – full prompts there.

- **CODE 01 • THE OPERATOR** – senior operator mode: one recommendation, reasons after, no caveats.
- **CODE 02 • THE INTERROGATOR** – asks the 3 questions that most change the output *before* doing anything.
- **CODE 03 • THE RED TEAM** – attacks your plan: 3 weakest assumptions, ranked by damage, cheapest test for each.

NEW CODES • 04-06

// CODE 04 • THE COMPRESSOR

Answer in 1/5 the length you normally would. Every sentence must earn its place. If I want depth I'll ask.

Use when answers keep ballooning and you're skimming instead of reading.

// CODE 05 • THE SPARRING PARTNER

Before you agree with anything I say, argue the strongest case against it. Then tell me which side you actually find more convincing and why.

Use when you catch the model agreeing with everything. Kills the yes-man.

// CODE 06 • THE SHIP-IT FILTER

We ship in 30 minutes. Given that constraint, what do we cut, what do we keep, and what's the single highest-leverage improvement we make first?

Use when a project is stuck in polish loops. Deadlines beat perfectionism.

NEW CODES • 07-10

// CODE 07 • THE EXPLAINER

Explain this back to me like I'm a smart 12-year-old, then list the 3 things you'd need to check before betting money you understood it right.

Use on anything you're about to act on but only half understand.

// CODE 08 • THE DELEGATOR

Turn this goal into instructions so specific that a brand-new assistant with zero context could execute them without asking me anything.

Use before handing work to an agent, a VA, or future-you. Vague goals die in handoff.

// CODE 09 • THE POST-MORTEM

That didn't work. Write the 5-line post-mortem: what we expected, what happened, the most likely cause, the test that confirms it, the fix.

Use the moment something fails – before you try again blind.

// CODE 10 • THE CLOSER

Before we wrap: what did you learn about how I work that you'd carry into our next session? Write it as 3 rules a future assistant should follow.

Use at the end of every serious session. The rules compound – save them.
